SCS GOVT. DEGREE COLLEGE MENDHAR: BRIEF PROFILE

CS GDC Mendhar is a newly established college (Est. 2005) under Prime Minister's Reconstruction Plan for Jammu & Kashmir State. This has just started taking steps towards its aim to impart education among learners in this far flung area of the State. Growing with intent for quality, achievement and success, the College is setting its goal to become dynamic and future focused, with a contemporary approach towards education, life and culture. Initially the college had started working in the premises of the Government Higher Secondary School (Boys) Mendhar and now has shifted to its own newly constructed building adjacent to the same school across the road towards *Dharana*, just 500 meters from Mendhar Bus stand. The foundation stone was laid down by the then Hon'ble Chief Minister Jb. Ghulam Nabi Azad on April 17th, 2007. With the grace of Almighty the College was Shifted from Govt. Higher Secondary School to its own new building on 27/10/2011.

Initially the College was started with Arts stream. Gen. English, Applied Maths, Computer Application, Education, Urdu, Hindi and Persian were introduced. In 2006, Political Science was also introduced. In 2010, Sociology and Economics were also offered and the Science Stream was also started in which Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany and Zoology were offered. During session, 2011-12, Geography, English Literature and Arabic were also added to the list.

With the implementation of New Education Policy in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, the college has adopted FYUGP system under NEP-2020 since last academic session i.e 2023-24. The College is affiliated to the University of Jammu, Jammu. The College is also covered under UGC Status Section 2(f) and 12B of UGC Act, 1956.

2. ADMISSION

- **2.1 Eligibility**: The admission of students to B.A./B.Sc. Semester I class is open to candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary part II Examination (10+2) of J&K State Board of School Education or any examination recognized as equivalent thereto. The admission is given strictly on the merit basis in accordance with the College intake capacity for different streams/subjects fixed by the Higher Education Department/University of Jammu and for candidates belonging to categories as per S.R.O. 126 dated: 28.06.1994 and as amended from time to time.
- **2.2** Application for Admission: Applicants desires of getting admission in B.A/B.Sc Programme(Semester-I) are required to submit their applications online through admission portal of J&K Higher Education Department. Admission will be granted on the basis of merit in CUET(UG) 2024.
- **2.3 Rejection of forms if any:** The college admission committee reviews the documents submitted by the applicants with application submitted online and allows the genuine applicants to get admission in the college. Incomplete applications or those without valid documents are rejected.
- **2.4 Fee Payment:** Applicants called for physical verification of documents (after their online review) are required to deposit the prescribed admission fee in the college through J&K Bank.

3.FOUR YEAR UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMME UNDER NEP-2020

The undergraduate degree should be of either a three year or four-year duration, with multiple entry and exit options within this period. The four years bachelor's programme is the preferred option as it allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education with a focus on major and minor subjects as per the student's preference. The undergraduate programmes shall extend over four academic years (eight semesters). The students can exit after the completion of one academic year (two semesters) with the certificate; diploma after the study of two academic years (four semesters) and regular bachelor degree after the completion of three academic years (six semesters). A candidate who successfully completes a three-year bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 7.5 and wishes to pursue the fourth year of the undergraduate program'ne shallbe allowed to continue the programme to obtain the bachelor's degree with honours/research.

3.1 PROGRAMMES STRUCTURE

- (i) Major Course (MJ): Any subject in a discipline in which student wants to graduate for 3 years bachelor degree or 4 years bachelor degree with honours/research.
 - (i) Minor Course (MI): Any subject other than major available in the college/offsite campus from any discipline.
 - (iii) Multidisciplinary Course (MD): Any subject/s of student's choice which is of interdisciplinary nature from faculties other than major with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester
 - (iv) Ability Enhancement Course (AE): It may be modern Indian language (MIL), English language (general), communication skill, mathematical ability. MIL. includes Hindi/Dogri/Urdu/Punjabi.
 - (v) **Skill Enhancement Course (SE):** The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the university of Jammu. The university departments/respective board of studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF.
 - (vi) Value Added Courses (VA): Four compulsory courses are:
 - (a) Understanding India
 - (c) Digital Technology
 - (b) Environmental Science and Education
 - (d) Health and Wellness

In addition, following optional value added courses shall be offered by the college subject to the availability of faculty/infrastructure:

- (a) Community Engagement
- © National Service Scheme (NSS)
- (e) Cultural

- (b) National Cadet Corp (NCC)
- (d) Sports
- (f) Yoga



Summer Internship: It shall be a short-term internship of duration 15 days in 5th semester fo job/professional training in a suitable organization or hands on training or activity-based course at college level in order to gain work experience. The internship shall be under a college teacher who will be designated as Internship Supervisor. After completion of summer internship students will have to produce a report related to the work carried out.

Research project/Dissertation: Project work is considered a unique course involving applying knowledge in solving analysing/exploring a real-life situation/complex problem/ data analysis. Project work has the intention to provide research competencies at the undergraduate level. It enables the acquisition of special/ advanced knowledge through support study/a project work. This course is applicable to students in 8" semester of undergraduate research program. A separate guideline shall be issued with regard to the evaluation of the Research project/Dissertation.

3.2 CREDIT PLAN OF FYUGP

1. Major Course

Each student will study for

- a) 62 Credits in Major for Three Years Graduation.
- b) 94 Credits in Major for Four Years Graduation (Honours).

Major Course can be any subject chosen from the following six disciplines

1. Science

II. Arts and Humanities

2. Minor Course

Each student will study

- a) 24 credits of minor course in same subject for three year graduation from 1 to 6 semester (4 credits in each semester)
- b) 32 credits of minor course in same subject for four year graduation (honours) (research)

3. Multidisciplinary Courses from other disciplines (Foundation Courses)

09 Credits of multidisciplinary courses of 03 credits each from 1 to 3 semesters from disciplines other than major with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester.

4. Ability Enhancement Courses

Modern Indian Languages (MIL)-Hindi/Dogri/Urdu/Punjabi. English language (General). Communication Skills and Mathematical Ability.

09 Credits of AEC Courses of 03 Credits each from 1 to 3 Semester.

5. Skill Enhancement Courses

06 Credits of Skill Enhancement Courses (SE) of 02 Credits each from 1 to 3 Semester The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the university of Jammu.

3.4 PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER

- (i) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-I to semester-II if he/she has secured pass marks in all internal assessment of the semester-1.
- (ii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-II to semester-III provided he/she has earned at least 50% of the total credits of semesters-1 as well as passed in all internal assessments of semester-II.
- (iii) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-III to semester-IV if he/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment in all the subjects papers of semester-III.
- (iv) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-IV to semester-V provided he/she has passed Sem-I and earned at least 50% of the total credits of semesters-III and 50% of the total credits of semesters-III as well as passed in internal assessments all papers of semester-IV.
- (v) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-V to VI if he/she has secured pass marks in all internal assessment in of the semester-V
- (vi) A student who does not fulfill the promotion criteria (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) above shall be declared fail in the semester concerned. However, he/she shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which he/she has secured pass marks.
- (vii) A student who has to reappear in a paper prescribed for semester-1 to IV shall appear in the subsequent semester end examination to be held as per the dates prescribed by the university.
- (viii) Only those candidates who have successfully completed three-years bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 7.5 shall be allowed to continue fourth year of the undergraduate programme to obtain the bachelor's degree (honours/research).
- (ix) A student will be eligible for promotion from semester-VII to semester-VIII if he/she has secured pass marks in all internal assessment of the semester-VI
- (x) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree with honors /research are eligible to enter the "Two Semester Master's Degree Programme".
- (xi) Candidates who successfully complete their four years bachelor's degree (research) are eligible to enter the "Doctoral (Ph.D.) Programme" in a relevant subject if he/she fulfills the criterion requirement as per NHEQF.
- (xii) A student who has to reappear in a paper(s) prescribed for semester-VI and VIII shall appearing the supplementary examination.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE STUDENTS

- 1. Ragging is strictly banned on or off the College campus. Any student found involved in Ragging shall be punished under rules.
- 2. Use of all sorts of drugs/Smoking is strictly prohibited.
- 3. There shall be no change of subjects after taking admission.
- 4. Any student found involved in defacing/disfiguring or otherwise damaging College property shall be punished strictly.
- 5. Students are not allowed to use Mobile Phone on the Campus.
- 6. Uniform is compulsory for all the students on all working days. Students without uniform will not be allowed on the College campus.
- 7. During off hours/free periods students are advised to sit in the library.
- 8. Disciplinary action shall be taken against the students who will be found missing the classes without genuine reason.
- 9. All the students are advised to carry I/Cards with them.
- 10. Continuous absence for 2 weeks shall amount to cancellation of admission.
- 11. No student is allowed to bring his/her relative or friend (who is not on the College roll) to the campus without some genuine reason
- 12. Don't spit in the corridors or on the walls or on the common resorts.
- 13. A student falling under shortage category shall not be eligible for any type of scholarship.
- 14. Student attending less than 75% lectures (theory as well as practical) shall be placed under shortage category and shall not be allowed to appear in the final examination.

The students who fails to secure 75% attendance shall not be eligible to appear in the Assessment tests & Examinations.



IDENTITY CARD

- 1. Every student on being admitted shall be issued an Identity Card which he/she will be carrying with them at all times and shall produce on demand by any member of the College staff anywhere within the College premises.
- 2. The loss of Identity Card should be reported immediately to the College Office.
- 3. A new Identity Card shall not ordinarily be issued.
- 4. However, after proper verification, a duplicate I-Card may be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- alongwith an undertaking/affidavit on non-judicial paper stamp paper of Rs. 10/-duly attested by a Magistrate/Notary.
- 5. Identity Card must be returned at the end of each academic session failing which an amount of Rs. 200/- shall be charged, along with the requisite undertaking/affidavit.

SCHOLARSHIPAND FINANCIALASSISTANCE

- a) Number of scholarships and financial assistance are given by the various agencies to the students of various categories. Scholarships are available for students belonging to SC/ST/RBA/Pahari Speaking/Low Income Group categories offered by the State Government and National Loan/National Merit Scholarships offered by the Government of India.
- b) In addition to the above mentioned scholarships, financial assistance is provided to the deserving students coming from highly needy and poor families by the College from the Students' Aid Fund. However, the criteria for the financial assistance to the deserving students shall be decided by the concerned committee constituted for the purpose on the basis of guidelines issued by the Government.
- c) Students are required to apply for various scholarships/financial assistance on the prescribed application form. The scholarship and financial assistance are, however, awarded to deserving students subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. A good conduct
 - 2. Satisfactory progress report in the studies
 - 3. Regularity in attendance
 - 4. A report of the teacher-in-charge
 - 5. Income/Category certificate issued by the competent authority
- d) Guardians/Parents of the students applying for any scholarship must given an undertaking that in case their ward participates in strikes or any other subversive activities, they will refund the amount of the scholarship received in one installment.

PRIZES, MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES OF MERIT

Students with outstanding performance in the curricular and extra-curricular activities of the College are awarded with prizes, medals and certificates of merit.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The students are encouraged to take part in various extra-curricular activities of the College. Debating Society: The College has a Debating Society that organizes debates, paper reading contests, seminars and quiz programs. Lectures and talks on topics of academic and national interests are frequently arranged.



COLLEGE MAGAZINE/COLLEGE NEWSLETTER: There is an opportunity for student writers to express their views in terms of contribution to the College magazine which is published every year. The editorial board comprises members of the teaching staff as well as students. Student writers are expected and encouraged to present their point of view regarding various issues on academic, social, moral and national themes with a liberty to write in the languages of their choice.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME: The College has a unit of NSS comprising student volunteers who work under the guidance of a Program Officer. The objective of this unit is to install a spirit of comradeship, love for humanity, and community service, particularly of the village folk.

National Cadet Corps (NCC): The College has a unit of NCC cadets (60 students) receiving training under the guidance of Associate NCC Officer (ANO).

SPORTS: Facilities are available for Cricket, Volley Ball, Hockey and certain indoor games, like, Chess, Carrom, etc.

BHARAT SCOUTS AND GUIDES: The college has established one unit of each Bharat Scouts and Guides to foster leadership, discipline, teamwork and a sense of social responsibility among the students. Students are encouraged to join the unit for their holistic development.

COLLEGE LIBRARY (Fully automized and integrated with College website: www.gdcmendhar.com)

The College library maintains, at present, a collection of above 11000 books related to the subjects taught in the College and also topics in general. The library also provides a reading corner to the students. Magazines, newspapers and journals, etc. are being subscribed for enhancing the general knowledge of the students.

Library Rules:

The library presently observes the same working hours and holidays as the College. It remains open for the students during the summer vacation from 8:00 am to 1:30 pm unless notified otherwise.



ACIION

- Every student at the time of borrowing books from the library shall present to the librarian his/her Identity Card. A person borrowing books from the library shall be held responsible for any loss of pages or damage of the book and he/she will have to pay fine in addition to double the cost of that book.
- ➤ College Teachers are not allowed to take more than ten books at a time. No member of the College Staff may borrow books from the library on his/her own name for the use of the students.
- Members of the College staff, on being transferred, retired and/or otherwise, are required to return all the books borrowed by them.
- > Students can borrow only two books at a time which includes at least one book related to the subject taken by him/her.
- > Students must return books issued to them within 15 days. Any student retaining a book after the time allowed shall have to pay a fine of Rupee One per day per volume until the same is returned, provided the fine incurred shall not exceed double the cost of the book.
- The librarian shall keep a record of the books issued. In the beginning of every month or at the time of realization of dues by the cashier, the librarian shall submit to the office a list of fine imposed on students for late return of books. They shall have to deposit the fine with the College cashier within 7 days of the submission of the list, failing which the student will not be allowed to attend the classes.
- Books required by the teachers of the College, if borrowed by any other person, must be returned on the receipt of a notice issued from the librarian.
- The same person may not borrow book for the second time within two days of its return by him/her. (This rule, however, does not apply to the teachers of the College).
- Any person who either has lost a book or torn, defaced and damaged it shall be liable to pay an amount not less than double the cost of the book. If it belongs to a set or series of volumes, he/she shall be liable to pay the cost of the whole set or series, unless he/she can replace it.
- > Students during free hours out of the College day may visit the library. No talking or disturbance of any kind is allowed in the library. Any infringement of this rule shall incur punishment/fine.
- Library is meant only for the use of those persons who are directly or indirectly connected with the academic life of the College.
- Books of the following description shall not be removed from the library except for a night and that too only by the College teacher with special permission of the Principal in writing:
 - a) Reference Books
 - b) Current periodicals
 - c) Sports and University Calendars
 - d) Books specially reserved (by order of the Principal)
- e) Rare books identified by the College Library Committee/Principal
- Periodicals shall not be issued except for consultation in the library premises.
- All books shall have to be returned to the library every year at the time of stock checking, especially in April/May. The librarian shall make a report of books found damaged/missing to the Principal, soon after the stock checking is over. During the period of stock checking, no person except with the special permission of the Principal shall have the access to the library.
- Teachers of the College, who wish to retain certain books during the summer vacation, shall have to return the same to the library at the time of stock checking.
- > Sleeping, smoking and spitting, etc. are strictly prohibited in the library.



COLLEGE BUS: Bus facility is available for the Girls student only. At present the Bus facility is being availed by the Girls student on Gursai, Harni & Ari route. The College Bus is run on no profit no loss basis. The Girls student availing the Bus have to deposit Bus fee in advance for six months @ Rs. 500 P.M.

COLLEGE UNIFORM: As pe the demand put forth by Students Union of the college and subsequent decision made by college Advisory and Discipline Committee, all the students of all semester is finalised below w.e.f session 2024-25.

For Girls:- White Kameez, Shalwar & Dupatta for Summer with black sweater/blazer/shawl for winter.

For Boys:- Black Pant, White Shirt and Black Shoes for Summer with black sweater/blazer in winter.

COMPLAINT/SUGGESTION BOX: The Complaint/Suggestion Box has been kept on the Main Entrance of the College. The students are advised to use the same. The Box is opened daily, the College Administrations looks into the matter and proper action is taken.

GENERAL RULES

- No outsider is allowed to enter the College without a valid reason.
- ➤ If a student remains absent from the College without permission for more than ten consecutive days, his/her name shall be struck off from the College rolls.
- ➤ Unlawful assembly of students in the College is banned.
- Writing of graffiti on the walls or sticking of posters is a cognizable offence.
- Ragging in any form, on or off the College Campus, including the Hostel is a cognizable offence and the student(s) involved in ragging will be severely punished, even to the extent of being expelled from the College.
- > Students resorting to violence in the campus or unfair means in the examination are liable to be issued a 'Bad Character Certificate.'
- A student desirous of withdrawing his/her name from the College rolls should submit an application, countersigned by the parent/guardian of the student. The withdrawal certificate shall be issued only after the student clears all College dues. Such students shall in no case be re-admitted during the same academic session.
- Any student, who indulges in any indiscipline in the College, shall not be eligible for any prize/certificate/award or scholarship from the Institution. This shall apply to all the students including NSS volunteers, NCC cadets, players or the hostellers.
- ➤ Mobile Phones are strictly prohibited on the College premises during working hours.
- The College authorities reserve the right to change, modify or suspend any of the rules as and when required.


